Dr. Sheila Steinberg is a newer member of the AGC community, having joined us at AGC 2019. Her research and teaching interests in environmental issues considered broadly and prominent positioning within the GIS book publication community provide AGC with the opportunity to grow its presence in important emerging research areas that connect geography with other disciplines. Her Irvine, California location (where she serves as professor at Brandman University) also provides an increased west coast presence on our board, which will be important if we desire to become more of a truly national community. Lastly, her featuring by Springer as one of the top 100 female scientists is a testament to the prominent position she has earned in the broader scientific community, and an indication of the new and helpful ideas and connections she can bring to our plans and discussions.
